Moving eight veterans with spinal cord injuries (SCI) approximately 275 miles northeast by vehicular transport was not felt to be a safe option, so the VA requested assistance from the Department of Defense. On Sunday, July 12, 2020, with DOD's concurrence, U.S. Transportation Command acted on the VA's request to rapidly move these SCI patients via a C-130 aircraft. Less than 48 hours later, they were safely secure in their new location at the VA North Texas Health Care System in Dallas, TX.

Approximately 8% of adults in America experience post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) every year.
